5) describe briefly our extracurricular activities such as school and community service, leadership, debating, theater, sports, music, art, student government, clubs and family responsibilities.

6) choose one item or similar items from the topics listed above (in 5) and describe in about 500 words what you did and why it is your most outstanding endeavor. Briefly conclude with its significance or potential benefit to society. If you are writing about a group project, be specific about the role you played and how much initiative you took. Do not submit any other material (photos, cassettes, scrapbooks, newspaper clippings, etc.).

7) share briefly your anticipated course of study (in forestry or forestry-related natural resources) and current career interests, including how you plan to continue to be active in volunteer or community organizations.
